20 Nominated for Outstanding Graduate Teaching Assistant Award

The 2016-17 Outstanding Teaching Assistant Awards program saw the highest number of nominations to date. The Graduate School will host a reception in honor of award recipients Apr. 21, 12:30-2:00, Cone 268.

The Outstanding Graduate Teaching Assistant Award recognizes teaching skills supported by strong student evaluations. Awards are at the Doctoral and Master's levels. All nominees are honored at the reception, and selected winners receive a \$500 award.

A call for nominees went to GPDs and faculty TA supervisors in early February.

Dissertation and Thesis Committees Now Available in DegreeWorks

Dissertation and thesis committees can now be viewed in DegreeWorks. When a committee is established, a new block of data will appear below the general student information on the audit. Information includes committee chair, graduate faculty representative and committee members.

Another recent change includes moving the program GPA from the degree block to the major block. This change, which does not alter its operation, accommodates the expansion of DegreeWorks to undergraduate students this year.

Summer/Fall 2017 Admissions Applications Remain Down

Overall, applications submitted for summer/fall 2017 compared to the same period last year are down over 7%. International applications, primarily to master's programs, are down 14% while domestic applications are up 4.5%. On the bright side, offers of admission are up over 20% compared to this time last year.

Half time Enrollment Definition changing for Fall Semester

UNC Charlotte's definition of half time enrollment is changing beginning in fall 2017. To be considered enrolled half time, graduate students must take at least 4.5 credit hours, which essentially means five or more credit hours for UNC Charlotte. NinerScholars Deadline Looms for Scholarships and Fellowships

April 15 is a big day for scholarships and fellowships as 58 at the graduate level have application deadlines on that date. Another 13 close on June 30. To apply, students should use the [NinerScholars Portal](#). Please note: Only eligible applicants through the NinerScholars Portal will be matched with these funding opportunities.

Students Should Indicate Intent to Enroll

With National Signing Day quickly approaching on April 15th, you can use eGRAD to track students who intend to enroll and also identify those who may not plan to enroll or who have not yet indicated their intent to enroll. Understandably, students offered funding also accept awards electronically.

After applicants are admitted, they are asked to confirm their intent to matriculate by completing and submitting the Enrollment Form in mygradschool.uncc.edu. Their responses are located on the decision tab in eGRAD and can help you gauge if new enrollment in your graduate program is on track with projections.

For admitted students who have not submitted the Enrollment Form by Apr. 15, you may wish to contact them to determine their enrollment plans. If they do not intend to enroll, please share the information with Graduate Admissions staff so that the decision not to enroll can be entered on their record.

Can Admission be Deferred?

Students who were admitted but did not enroll may not defer admission, but they can easily re-apply.

Admission is withdrawn for any applicant who does not enroll for the term to which s/he is admitted. However, the applicant still can be considered for a future term by logging into the application portal (<https://mygradschool.uncc.edu>) and creating a new application. Original biographical information will pre-populate to simplify the process.

Test scores sent with the original application will automatically attach to the new application, but current transcripts will need to be uploaded. If required, the applicant will need to enter three recommenders and ask them to submit current information, as well as to pay the application fee when submitting the new application.

GASP Policy: Ask Your Students to [Apply for NC Residency](#)

The difference between resident and non-resident tuition is \$13,171 per student, per year. If domestic out-of-state GASP students obtained NC residency for 2017-18, \$540,011 in additional funds would be available to support doctoral students.

To spread limited tuition dollars and support to as many exemplary students as possible, beginning fall 2017 non-resident tuition differential will apply only for the *first year* for new domestic out-of-state students. Students must obtain North Carolina residency by the second year of enrollment or petition the Graduate School for a continuation of the non-resident funding.

May 1 Deadline to Apply for Giles Dissertation-Year Graduate Fellowship

Encourage eligible students to complete an applicant profile by May 1 at <https://ninerscholars.uncc.edu/> to be considered for the Giles Dissertation-Year Graduate Fellowship. The Giles Fellowship provides an award of \$20,000 plus \$1,000 for travel, health insurance, and full-tuition and fees for students who will complete all of their degree requirements during the award year.

The student must be registered during the fall and spring term for doctoral dissertation research credit.

Applications Open for 2018-19 Fulbright programs

The deadline is Aug. 1 to apply for Fulbright programs for the 2018-19 academic year.
